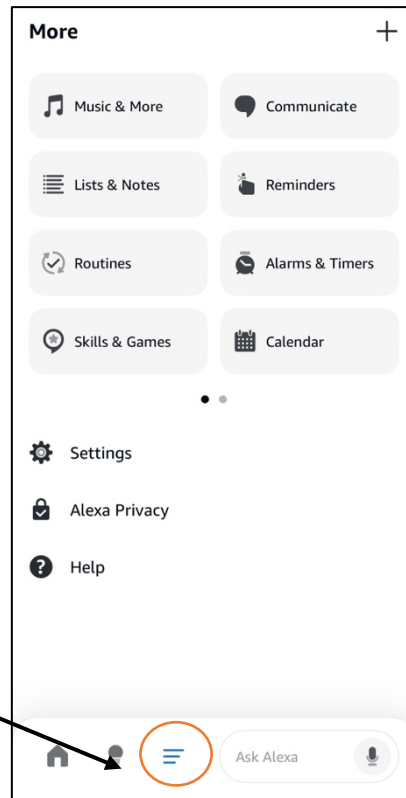


# How to set up multiple voice commands which mean the same action, on your Alexa App

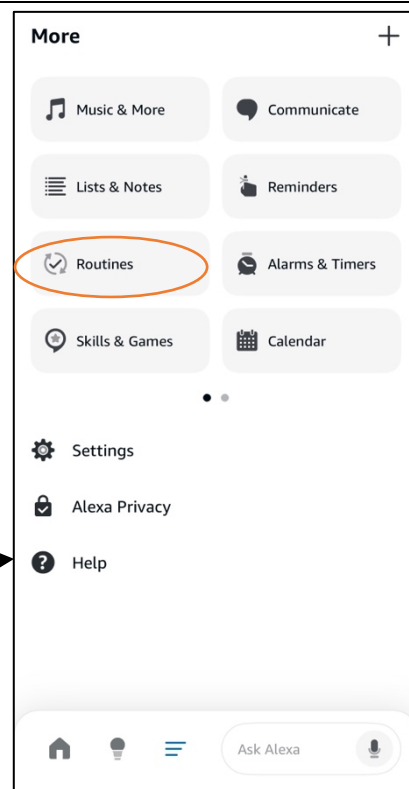
## Step by Step Instructions with App Navigation

2. Tap **More** (≡) at the bottom right.

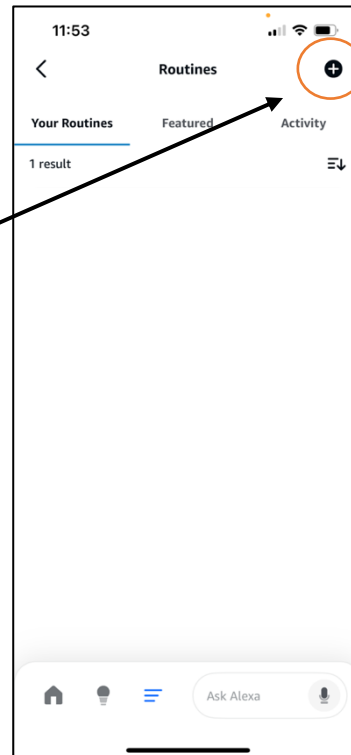


3. Tap **Routines**.



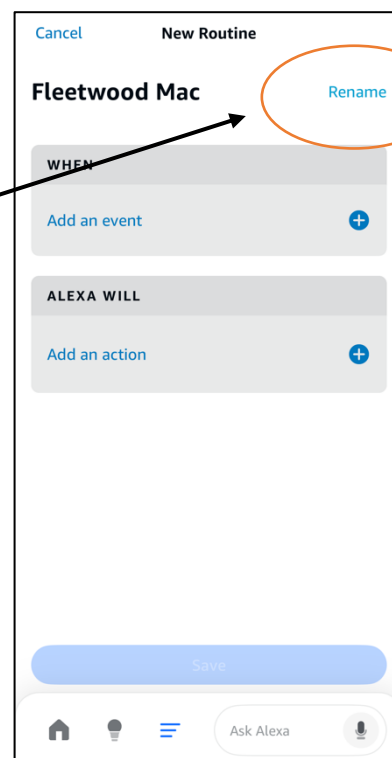

button to create a new routine .



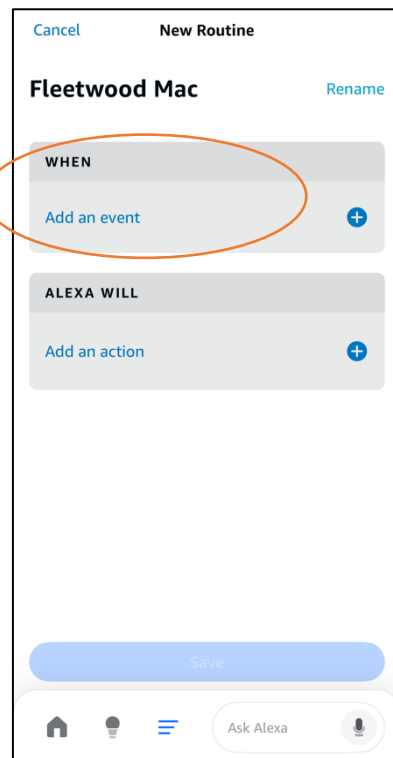
**5. Tap rename and add a**

Mac”

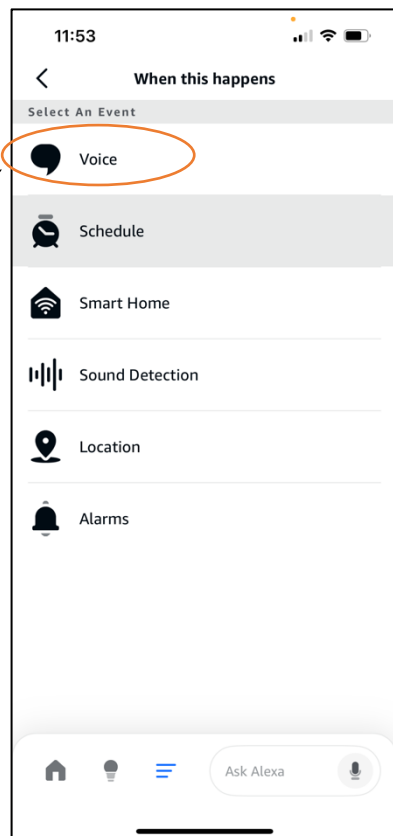


## How to set up multiple voice commands which mean the same action, on your Alexa App

**Add an event**

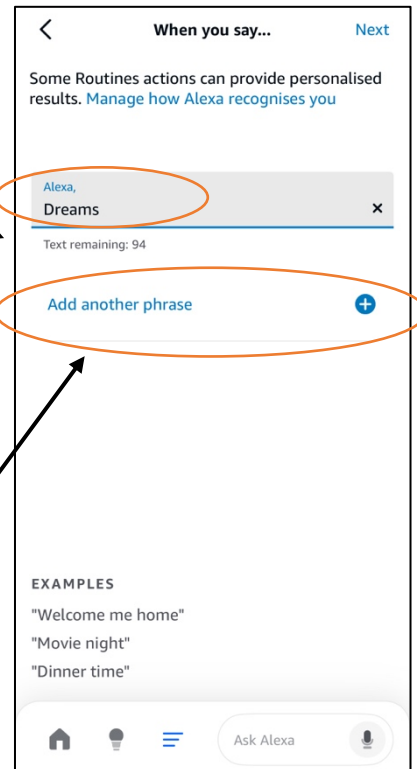


7. Tap **Voice**.



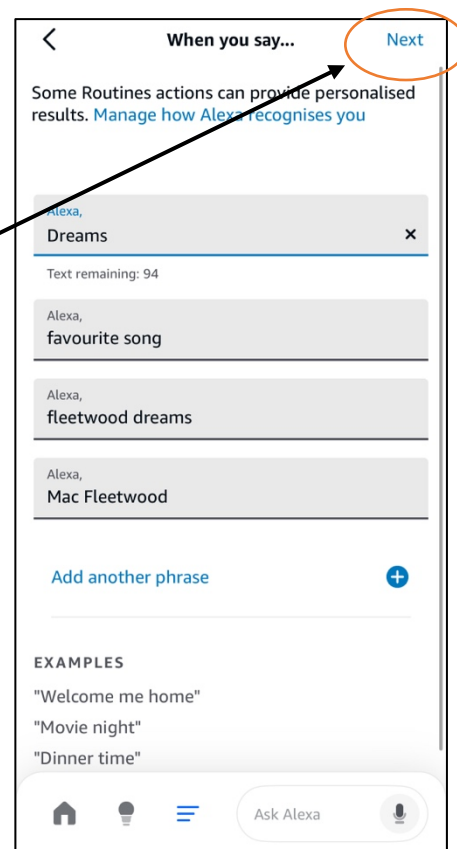
## How to set up multiple voice commands which mean the same action, on your Alexa App

**8. Type in different voice commands, that you may use which mean the same thing.**




**9. Tap add another phrase**

**10. Add all the potential voice commands and press next**

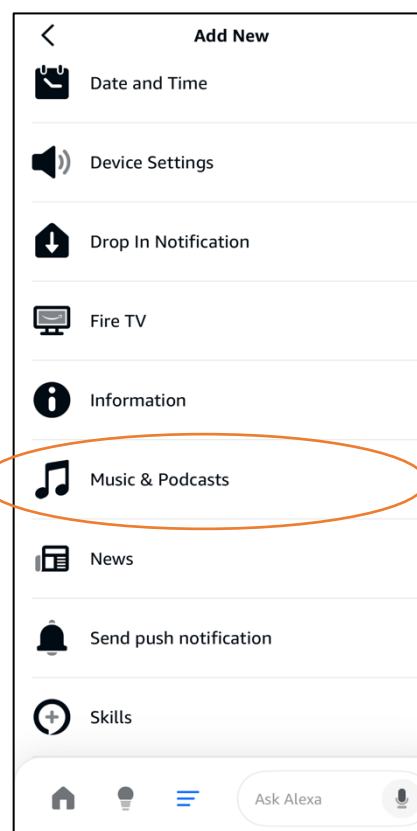


## How to set up multiple voice commands which mean the same action, on your Alexa App

**add an action**




12. Choose the action.

tap **Music and Podcasts**

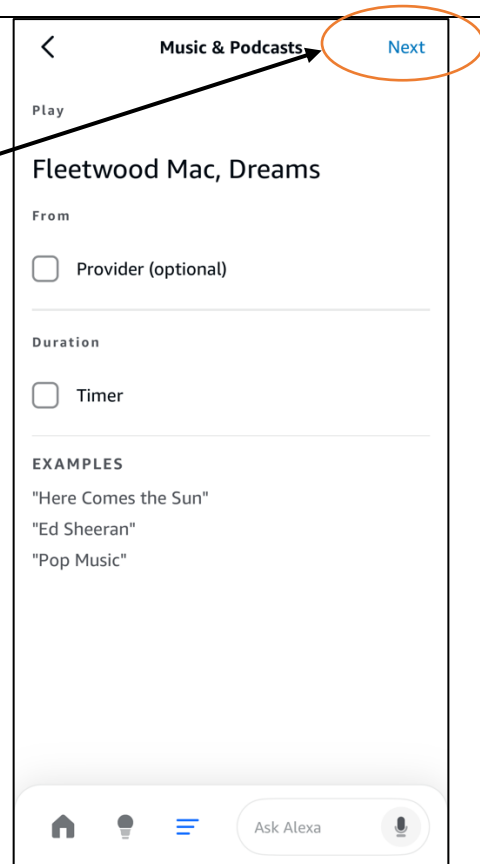


## How to set up multiple voice commands which mean the same action, on your Alexa App

14. Tap **Next**

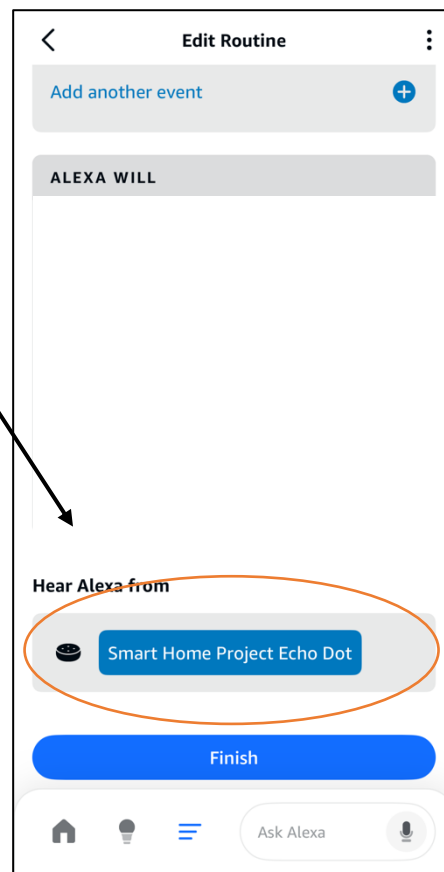

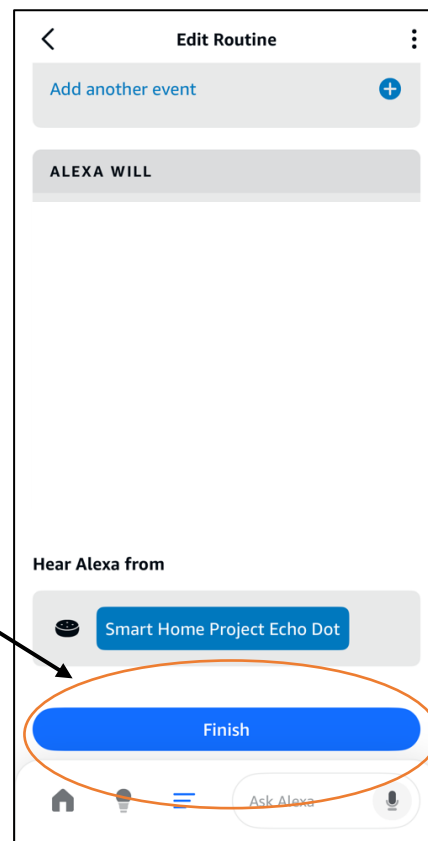
15. Under Hear Alexa
